THEOLOGICAL VISION FOR 4TH SOIL PARENTING

We Believe...

- 1. We believe that vibrant faith in Jesus Christ lived out in community transforms our world to more deeply reflect the Kingdom of God.
- 2. We believe that increasing parents' capacity to be present to the Spirit of God and to be present to others is formative and has a transformational influence on their children.
- 3. We believe that faith in God is primarily formed through trusting, loving relationships.
- 4. We believe that families are a living expression of the trinitarian God—a communion of persons bonded in abundant love that overflows and transforms the broader community.
- 5. We believe the church plays an indispensable, supportive, faith-forming role for parents who are the primary faith influencers in the lives of their children.
- 6. We believe that new forms of families share the same potential for holiness as "traditional families" and that children benefit from non-parent adults who relate to them like parents.
- 7. We believe that Christian practices centered on relationship building are powerful faith forming experiences.
- 8. We believe that the formation of faith is the intersection of God's grace and action in our lives, and our willing, open, and active response to that grace.
- 9. We believe that Christian faith, as shared in Scripture, is a story, and parents invite children to faith by engaging in a dynamic dialogue between their own life story and the Christian story, particularly as it is told and lived by Jesus in the Gospels.
- 10. We believe that parenting is a calling, and when parents become aware of their calling and respond to it with intention, parenting takes on new meaning resulting in stronger formation for the parents and their children.
- 11. We believe the process of Christian discipleship changes from culture to culture, but the flow of influence from parents to children in their faith development crosses cultural boundaries.
- 12. We believe that processes of deep listening, powerful questioning, and clear and direct communication can raise new awareness in a person and can be faith forming tools for parents.
- 13. We believe that a lifelong, embedded faith in God is primarily influenced by two factors: a) parents' vertical relational intimacy with God lived through Christian practices, and b) parents' horizontal relational intimacy with their children lived through warmth and appropriate structure.
- 14. We believe that parents set a "glass ceiling" of religious commitment above which their children infrequently rise.
- 15. We believe that parents who are confident in and equipped for a conversational approach that expresses their faith increases the odds of their children having a lifelong faith journey.
