WE ASKED




- If their surrounding community saw them as a "familyfriendly" church.

WHAT DO YOU NOTICE?

- Seem to be overscheduled and exhaustingly busy all the time.
- The need for two incomes to provide and the strain it causes.
- May not be using the resources we provide.
- Many parents know little about Scripture or the faith.
- They do not prioritize a relationship with Jesus as part of their lives.
- Not worshipping God, they are worshipping sports etc.
- Helping them to make church a bigger priority.

FEEDBACK

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HE (Parents) IS THE PROBLEM!

They aren't doing things the way WE want.



Why aren't they there?

(Perceptions from church leaders)

- Parents don't care enough about faith
- They don't think church matters
- Other priorities (sports, activities, schedules)
 keep them away
- Families are too busy / distracted
- Parents lack biblical knowledge or commitment

What we've noticed.

(Real life for parents)

- Parents DO care about their faith and their kids' faith
- Parents are desperate for community
- Parents' other priorities aren't always warped
- Families are interested in engaging their relationship with Jesus in ways that don't fit our box
- Parents' faith grows through their children's faith
 AND through discipling their children

What Can We Do About It?

- First, listen...
- Everyday ways for parents to strengthen their impact on their kids.
- Help make worship "NORMAL" for families—activities of worship are foreign to most families, so normalize them, even at home.
- Help families practice worship in low-stress ways.
- Stop making church the only place that worship can happen.



Opportunities for Partnering with Parents in New Ways

RAISING Faithful Kids



Important & Strategic Markers



- Whatever we do, it must flow into the natural rhythms, lifestyles, and relational patterns
 that already exist among parents...
- To model what we do after Jesus, we must focus on relational practices that are designed to live out in the normal relational ecosystem of parents.
- What's practiced at church should have an obvious and natural tie into what's practiced at home, and vice versa. What children are learning at home from their parents should have a direct connection to what they experience in the church worship service, and the worship service should help kids make connections to their home's everyday spiritual practices.
- Jesus focuses on the heart more than the head. He wants people to understand and embrace the truth, but more than that, He wants us to taste and see the goodness of God, and abide in His love. These priorities must be reflected in what we do in worship, and what we do at home.



What if we learned to reengage parents and kids in our existing worship service?



- We're looking for churches that want to do more with their parents—to come alongside them in practical ways to help fuel their faith-nurturing influence in their kids' lives...
- What if we had simple tools that would help us renovate the normal things we do in worship so that parents and kids can more actively participate?
- What if our renovated worship practices were modeled and practiced at home, with parents and their kids, in simple, natural ways?
- What if we ramped-up how we intentionally listen to parents, and established a new "feedback loop" with them?
- What if we shifted our focus in our worship service just enough to affect the whole culture of the church, and the community took notice?

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
